

Black Spruce

Black Spruce is a wetland-loving native, growing to 35-50 feet with a spread of 20-30 feet.

It is a min component of boreal forest, and it prefers wet to moist soil in full sun to partial shade. With tamarack, a good early colonizer of bogs.



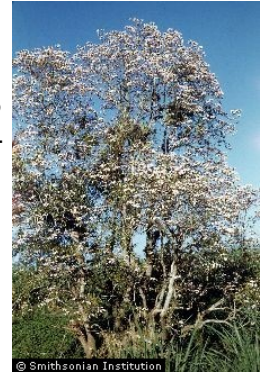
Red Pine

Red Pine grows to 65-100 feet (spread 40-70 feet) and prefers moist to dry soil in full sun to partial shade conditions. Growth rate is moderately fast.



White Cedar

White Cedar grows to 30-45 feet (spread 20-30 feet) and prefers wet to moist soil in full sun to partial shade conditions. Growth rate is slow. Super for wildlife!



White Spruce

Native White Spruce grows to 50-70 feet (spread 20-30 feet) and handles dry to moist soil conditions in full sun to partial shade. A super native windbreak; deer-resistant., with a moderate growth rate.



Tamarack

Tamarack grows to 40-65 feet (spread 20-40 feet) and prefers wet soil in full sun conditions. Its growth rate is slow to moderate. Needles turn brilliant gold and drop in fall, unique among conifers.



White Pine

White Pine grows to 75-100 feet (spread 50-75 feet) and prefers moist to dry soil in full sun to partial shade. Growth rate is moderately fast. Graceful, thin needles in groups of five. Our state tree!



Norway Spruce

Norway Spruce is fast-growing, reaching 50-70 feet (spread 20-35 feet). It tolerates wetter soil conditions than White Spruce.
